Military Chaplain Endorsement Requirements and Responsibilities

Endorsement Requirements

- Agree with and practice the UPCIs Articles of Faith.
- Fulfill all the requirements of the Department of Defense.
- Undergraduate degree of 120 semester hours from an accredited institution.
- Master of Theology degree (minimum of 72 semester hours) from an accredited seminary or graduate school of theology. (Master of Divinity degree preferable).
- Take the required four doctrinal courses at Urshan Graduate School of Theology (UGST) or complete UPCI Ministry Central Reading Requirements, if attending a graduate theological school other than UGST (See *UPCI Endorsed Chaplains*: https://ugst.edu/academics/degree-programs/certificate-programs).
- Ordained by the United Pentecostal Church International. (Non-UPCI Ministers: Ordained by an organization whose doctrine agrees with the UPCI's Articles of Faith).
- Familiar with the provisions of the UPCI Manual relating to ministerial licensing in Article VII and with the provisions for military chaplaincy in Article IX, Section 2 paragraph 4, and OEE Policies, Section 9 Department of Military and Veterans Affairs Chaplaincy Policies.
- Provide a personal testimony/philosophy of ministry statement to the UPCI Military Chaplaincy Endorsing Agent.
- Letter of endorsement for the military chaplain candidate program from the UPCI Department of Military and Veterans Affairs Chaplaincy (DMAVAC) Military Chaplaincy Endorsing Agent (If applicable).
- Letter of approval from the UPCI district superintendent and local sponsoring church pastor. (Non-UPCI candidates will provide a letter of approval from their ordaining bishop or superintendent and their local pastor).
- Two years full-time professional ministry experience (i.e. leading ministries, conducting worship services, baptisms, communion services, weddings, funerals, grief counseling, etc.). (Note: Active duty only; Not a requirement for Army Reserve and Army National Guard).
- Signed statement of affirmation concerning UPCI military chaplain endorsement requirements and responsibilities.
- Apply for ecclesiastical endorsement for the military chaplaincy through the UPCI DMAVAC. Contact the UPCI DMAVAC for an application at **636-229-7959** or **rrobinson@upci.org**.
- Successful interview with the UPCI DMAVAC Advisory Board in Weldon Spring, MO.
 It is strongly recommended that the candidate's spouse also meet with the DMAVAC Advisory Board for this interview.

• Letter of endorsement for the military chaplaincy from the UPCI DMAVAC Military Chaplaincy Endorsing Agent.

Endorsement Responsibilities

- Willingness to facilitate and coordinate programs for individuals of all religious faiths.
- Be a UPCI endorsed military chaplain of honor and nothing negative should be said about the chaplains they minister with or about other denominations.
- UPCI endorsed military chaplains are under the jurisdiction of the Office of Education and Endorsement through the UPCI Department of Military and Veterans Affairs Chaplaincy (DMAVAC).
- Support and advance the strategic plan goals, objectives, and initiatives of the UPCI DMAVAC.
- Provide current contact information, updated status changes, and routine communications
 (i.e. quarterly ministry reports, annual evaluation report, etc. per the DMAVAC
 prescribed reporting format) to the UPCI DMAVAC, 36 Research Park Court, Weldon
 Spring, MO 63304.
- UPCI endorsed military chaplains will pay their tithes from all military pay to the Office of Education and Endorsement, with a percentage to be given back to the chaplain only for current-year General Conference expense.
- UPCI endorsed military chaplains will attend the UPCI DMAVAC Chaplain Huddles and the General Conference of the United Pentecostal Church International for educational and training purposes.
- UPCI endorsed military chaplains' first responsibility is to the military.
- UPCI endorsed military chaplains are not to be responsible to any local church or district where they are stationed.
- Attend a local church whenever possible and always work in harmony with the district superintendent.
- Attend district functions only as these do not interfere with military duty.
